

Advancement Requirements (9-12)

The District has established a set of advancement requirements for 9-12 grade students which will act as a guide in helping students move methodically and purposefully on a course that will eventually lead to high school graduation. Therefore, the following advancement requirements are required in the District:

1. To advance to the 10th grade, students must earn at least 12 credits in 9th grade.
2. Students may be retained at each grade level if the following year requirements are not met by August 30:

A minimum of 12 credits is required for advancement into the 10th grade to be a Sophomore.

A minimum of 24 credits is required for advancement into the 11th grade to be a Junior.

A minimum of 36 credits is required for advancement into the 12th grade to be a Senior.

If there is some doubt as to which class meeting and activity the student should attend, ask the principal for the correct number of units earned to date from the student's permanent record.

Once a student has been admitted to an early graduation program, the student will be considered a member of the Senior class.

Change of Class Schedule

Students may alter their class schedule up to the fifth day of each semester. Students, grades 9-11, should normally carry eight (8) classes as a standard load.

Dropping a Course

A course dropped after the fifth day of each semester will result in the loss of that credit. The school is organized on a semester basis. In cases where a change is necessary after the fifth day of the semester, arrangements must be made through the counselor/principal.
